



### HALLOWEEN EVENTS

Parents please save the date to attend activities at Parkview on Tuesday, October 31st, 2017. We will have a Halloween parade for parents to attend on Tuesday, October 31st at 1:45. Students will be allowed to wear costumes for the parade with the following guidelines:

### PARKVIEW RECYCLING PROGRAM

Did you know that our school participates in a recycling program called *GreenFiber*?

Our school recycles as much paper as possible. In fact, most of the paper we are printing on this year is recycled paper from DiscoverCard.

Kinds of paper of school recycles includes:

- Magazines
- Catalogs
- Office Paper
- Yellow Page Directories
- Direct Mail
- Brochures
- Pamphlets
- Soft Cover Books

Last year, the Salt Lake City School District collected and recycled a total of 1,100,000 pounds of paper and cardboard, diverting 550 tons of valuable commodity from the landfill. Additionally, they earned \$14,300 by recycling and saved over 9,350 trees.
